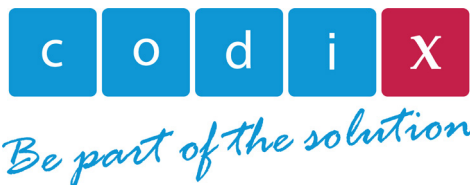

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The 54th Annual Meeting of FCI will take place in Washington D.C. from Sunday 19 June until Thursday 23 June 2022. The theme of this Annual Meeting will be: A changing Economic, Environmental & Trade Landscape: How will the Receivables and Supply Chain Finance industry cope?

Washington D.C. was chosen as the venue for this Annual Meeting, in part due to the historical importance the United States has played as the first country to launch what is referred to as the modern era of factoring dating back to 1814. But it was also chosen due to its political prominence as a leading global power, its majestic beauty and cultural prominence. The conference hotel, The Willard InterContinental is centrally located less than two blocks from the White House. We have prepared a special agenda with an exciting list of speakers and made more time for bilateral meetings, all located in a very historic, unique and beautiful setting.

This Annual Meeting will focus on the impact of the **changing economic landscape** with the rise in inflation and interest rates. It will also cover such themes as **digitalization** and **changes in regulations and accounting requirements**; the rise of **Fintechs** and the Distribution of Capital and Liquidity in Receivables Finance; the **risk of Fraudulent Activity** in Receivables Finance; the impact of a degrading environment, changes in the workplace stemming from the Pandemic, and the evolution of women and youth in a male dominated work society; the role of

Advocacy including issues like the change in definition of default in the EU; the effects of the implementation of Basel III rules and new questions relating to the role **credit insurance** will play as an enabler of risk mitigation; the elimination of LIBOR and the implementation of new overnight risk-free reference rates; and lastly the current state of the development of the model law on factoring by the **UNIDROIT**, a project fully endorsed and supported by FCI.

We hope that the Annual Meeting will be attended by both CEOs/Managing Directors as well as those executives in charge of International and Reverse factoring/Supply Chain Finance business units. Attendees will benefit fully from networking opportunities throughout the week. All social activities during the Annual Meeting are open to all registered delegates, including sponsors, observers and potential new members, to maximize the networking offering.

Finally, we have known for many years that the presence of spouses/partners/family members greatly improves the overall climate and it is hoped therefore that many of the delegates will be accompanied to enjoy the very interesting spouses' program. In times of significant economic contraction followed by a huge swing in economic growth, rising inflation and interest rates, which is what we are witnessing today businesses will be severely impacted. With the continuation of the pandemic, especially in Asia, the conflict between Russia and Ukraine, and the fast pace changes in the global economy, what can the industry expect to see in the future? Also, the recent changes to accounting rules governing SCF by the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) and the International Accounting Standard Board (IASB) will require disclosures of all key aspects relating to reverse factoring programs on the corporate buyer's financial statements is now settled however the potential implications of whether there will be future changes to the accounting treatment of trade debt on their balance sheet is still a threat. And lastly, other issues like the implementation of Basel III rules, elimination of LIBOR and the implementation of new overnight risk-free reference rates, the change in the definition of default in the EU and the rise of fraud will be discussed. Global regulators led by an encroaching European Central Bank and an aggressive US Administration are calling on financial institutions to account for the impact that they and their clients may have on the environment. The National Museum of American History: Kenneth E. Behring Center collects, preserves, and displays the heritage of the United States in the areas of social, political, cultural, scientific, and military history. Among the items on display is the original Star-Spangled Banner. The museum is part of the Smithsonian Institution.

The museum opened in 1964 as the Museum of History and Technology. It was one of the last structures designed by the renowned architectural firm McKim Mead & White. In 1980, the museum was renamed the National Museum of American History to represent its mission of the collection, care, study, and interpretation of objects that reflect the experience of the American people.

Anderson House, also known as Larz Anderson House, is a Gilded Age mansion located on Embassy Row in the Dupont Circle neighborhood of Washington, D.C. It now houses the Society of the Cincinnati's international headquarters and a research library on 17th and 18th century military and naval history and the art of war. It is also open to the public as a historic house museum about life in Washington in the early

20th century. The Andersons used the house to entertain the social and political elite of America and abroad, as well as to showcase their collection of fine art and historic artifacts that the couple acquired in their extensive travels.

Embassy Row is a place of stately grace and history, and is home to many diplomatic delegations, some in homes built by turn-of-the-last-century tycoons. A combination bus and walking tour will reveal the decorum and intrigue behind these historical buildings and the countries that are now housed in them.



The National Cathedral, which hosts presidential funerals and other state ceremonies, set atop a hill, its tower remaining the highest point in the city. Built in the English Gothic style, the National Cathedral has no local congregation and is considered to be a house of worship honoring all faiths from around the world. After lunch at Sfoglina, transfer back to the hotel.

Marjorie Merriweather Post, heiress to the Post cereal fortune, purchased the twenty-five-acre Hillwood Estate in 1955. Situated in Northwest Washington, the newly renovated estate is a lush enclave in the middle of the city, overlooking Washington's Rock Creek Park. Upon Ms. Post's passing, her children opened up the estate to the public and it has since become one of the premier art collector's museums in the United States. Features include the most comprehensive collection of Russian imperial art outside of Russia and a world-renowned collection of eighteenth-century French decorative art and furnishings. After lunch in the Hillwood Café, transfer back to the hotel.



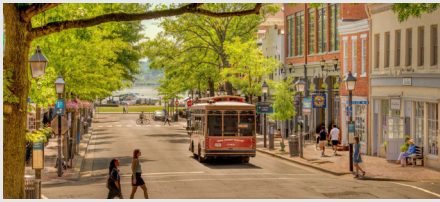

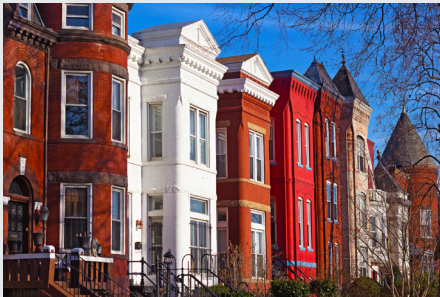
